October

2023



OVERVIEW

In October, Canada held the target policy rate at 5.0%, marking the third consecutive decision to not increase the rate. Consumer pressures lessened in the Fall, with total CPI inflation declining to 3.8% in September. Ontario's labour force held steady in October, with an incremental increase of 0.1% in employment. Youths in Ontario saw unemployment increase, with a youth unemployment rate of 11.4% in October (+0.9%).



With the Fall rolling around, the City of Hamilton saw drop in unemployment and increase in overall employment. Compared to other regions in Ontario, Hamilton had an overall lower unemployment rate. Some of the decline in the unemployment rate can be attributed to more youths exiting the labour force to go back into school/training. With Fall in fullswing, more Professors were sought after in October from our Job Board. As a whole. Ontario's Educational Services saw growth in October.



Source: Statistics Canada (2023). Labour Force Survey With the fall rolling around, the Hamilton CMA saw an 0.2% increase in the Labour Force. In the month of October, unemployment fell by 2,700 persons, with the Unemployment Rate at 5.2% (-0.3%). Compared to the province (6%) Hamilton boasts a low unemployment rate.

Employment was up in October, with an increase of 4,500 persons in the Labour force and an Employment Rate of 60.8% (+0.5). Participation in the labour force remained relatively the same, with a slight increase of 0.1% to 64.1%.



In October, Hamilton's youth labour force shrank by 5,500 youths. Both employment and unemployment declined in October as more youths exited out of the labour force and back into school/training. This was further reflected in the youth unemployment rate, which fell 3.1% to 11.4% in October (same as Ontario).

Compared to other CMAs in proximity, the Hamilton CMA had a relatively low employment rate (55.1%) among youth in October. The Brantford CMA had the highest employment rate among youths at 64.7%, with Toronto boasting the lowest at 47.9%.

In October, Information, Culture and Rec was the top growing industry with an increase of 17.4K workers. Offsetting 88% of the loss seen in September. Following was Educational Services, gaining 9K workers on top of the 27.8K in September. Ontario's Health Care sector also saw growth in October, with a consecutive increase of 6.9K.

Wholesale and Retail Trade saw a loss of 29.2K workers in October, This marks another month of employment contraction as the industry lost 17K some workers in September. Accommodation and Food Services was one of last month's top growing industries but saw a decline of 8.5K in October. The Finance and related industries remains top 3 declining in October, with a loss of 7.3K and 20.6K across September-October.




